MESSAGE FROM THE CITY MANAGER

Welcome to April, Berkley!

While April showers bring May flowers, April is truly the transition period between the cold, brittle, dark winter and the warm, bright, beautiful springtime.

Many of us look forward to the spring when we don't have to wear a coat outside or keep up with our gloves to tackle the snow. April is especially interesting because we are wearing fewer layers than in previous months but we are still looking forward to brighter days.

As we are transitioning to warmer weather and better times, our community is also transitioning through election law changes at the State level and a vote to change the city millage rate to maintain our city services. Despite the changes that we all may be feeling during this period, I want to remind everyone we are still a strong community that can hold our own weight, and that we are all in this together. Many residents have questions and concerns and my team is more than happy to explain the Headlee Override millage or the voting process. For those who are voting for the first time or the 100th time, accessibility to voting absentee has been enhanced and our City Clerk's Office is available to walk each of you through this process. For all Berkley residents including myself, understanding the impacts to Headlee and Proposal A may be a new and daunting topic and I am focused on ensuring we as the city are fully transparent about what this tax increase means for everyone and how the funds will be utilized pending the possible changes after the May election. I want all members of our community to be well-informed of what they are voting for on May 2nd.

With this, please do not be afraid to ask questions to gain more clarity when faced with issues that you may not be familiar with. We are asking our residents for a reinvestment in the city funds that Berkley has lost over the past decade-plus due to the State's Headlee Amendment (1978) and Proposal A (1994). This millage, if passed, would increase the city's millage rate to 3.4581 mills for our operating and police/fire (public safety) fund. This increase would mean each home paying more in property taxes but it would also mean more funding that would be directly invested back into our community services.

As an administration we cannot advocate for a specific outcome, however, we want voters to make a well-informed and educated decision that best suits themselves and their families. We will continue to maintain an open dialogue with you and our community members who have questions or concerns about this potential change. If you see outside information that you are unsure of please let us know so that we can give you credible and accurately sourced information. Again, our city staff, city council, and community are a team and despite all of the changes we are undergoing as a region, state, and nation, we still can rely on each other to remain Berkley strong. Whatever the outcome, we as an administration will embrace the change and continuously work to make Berkley the best place to live, work, and play.

2023 Elections ... #BerkleyVotes

The City of Berkley will be holding a special election on **May 2, 2023.** To learn more about what's on the ballot in May, please visit www.berkleymich.org/millage.

Absentee ballots for the Special Election were mailed at the end of March. If you did not receive an absentee ballot or would like one, please contact the Clerk's Office. All voting precincts will be open on election day from 7 am to 8 pm on May 2nd.

New for the May 2 Special Election

With the passage of Proposal 22-2, return postage will be applied to outgoing election mail. Save your stamp if you are planning on mailing it in this election. Also, election mail can always be placed in our secure, 24-7 drop box at the entrance of City Hall.

BERKLEY'S HEADLEE OVERRIDE MILLAGE

Due to Michigan's state laws, specifically, Headlee and Proposal A, Berkley has lost the ability to levy 3.4581 of those mills over the past decade. The city has reached the point where we can no longer maintain service amenities with the current funding structure.

It is estimated that if the voters were to approve the Headlee Override at 3.4581 mills, it would raise approximately \$2.5 million within the first year for Berkley. This millage is to restore and specifically set up for the city's general operating fund. The general operating fund is what finances all of our departments, capital investments, and infrastructure.

If voters approve the Headlee Override millage, residents will see this on their Summer 2023 taxes. The tax dollars levied by restoring the millage will aid in continuing the full package of services residents experience now and the development of capital and infrastructure projects that have been delayed.

We want you to be able to see how this will individually impact you. Thus, we have developed a tax calculator using the latest tax assessments (provided by Oakland County).

Once we have that data (provided to us by Oakland County and the March Board of Review), we will work on the next phase of the budget process.

The City Council will review and approve the budget in May.

Yard Waste Collection


Yard waste and compost pick up BEGINS THIS MONTH (April). This service includes **FREE** pick up of paper bags or cans **ONLY**. There is a 50-pound limit, and cans must be identified as containing 'yard waste'.

This does include branches UNDER 4 feet in length and UNDER 2 inches in diameter. Pick-up will occur on your regularly scheduled trash day. Learn more at <u>www.berkleymich.org/yardwaste</u>.

Chipper Service

Public Works provides a monthly chipper route service that typically takes about a week to complete (weather permitting). **The chipper service is for branches over 4' in length and over 2" in diameter.** Residents should continue to contact the DPW if chipper service is needed at 248-658-3490. You can also sign up by filling out the <u>CHIPPER ROUTE FORM</u>. Please note, it often takes a full week to get through the entire City.
